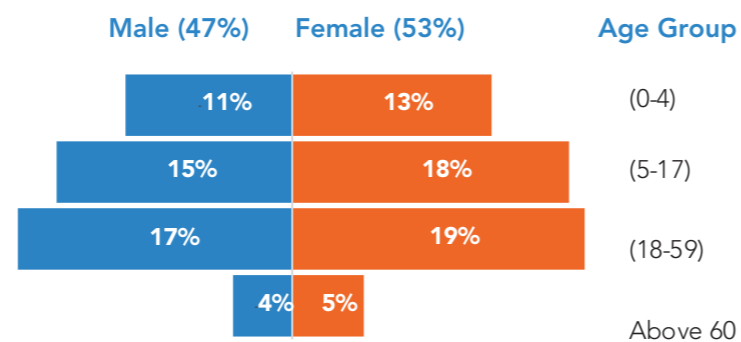
Map of verified IDP sites in Luuq - March 2022

Assessment overview

A joint IDP site verification exercise was conducted in Luuq in March 2022. The operation was led by CCCM partners and local authorities, WVI, NRC, SHRA, JUCRI and IOM. 34 IDP sites were identified hosting 8,233 households or 51,028 individuals. Compared to the IDP site master list IDP population for Luuq, there was an increase of 21 IDP sites, 4,950 Households or 32,013 individuals.

People living with health difficulty

Using the Washington Group Disability Questions, statistics of people living with health difficulty were derived

923 (1.8%)
people living with health difficulty

- 173 (50% Female)** have difficulty with seeing (even wearing glasses)
- 175 (47% Female)** have difficulty with hearing (even using a hearing aid)
- 155 (54% Female)** have difficulty with communicating and/or understanding
- 185 (44% Female)** have difficulty with walking and/or climbing stairs
- 109 (53% Female)** have difficulty with dressing and/or washing
- 126 (44% Female)** have difficulty with remembering/concentrating

Eviction Risk Mapping

IDP sites were assessed based on their risk of eviction. Several factors were put into consideration such as IDP site tenure, type of agreements in place and whether an eviction notice has been issued recently.

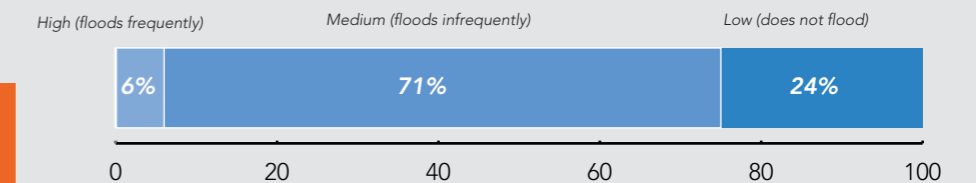
6% of IDP sites have been classified as having extreme (3%) and high (3%) risk of eviction

- 79%** of sites are landowner authorized occupancy
- 68%** of sites have no agreement in place
- 100%** of those that have agreements have oral agreements
- 97%** of those that have agreements have no agreed end dates
- 3%** of sites have been issued with eviction notice within the last 3 months

Flood Risk Mapping

IDP sites were assessed based on their risk of flooding.

2 IDP sites (6%) have been classified as extreme (always floods) and high (floods frequently)
